General Information

All hands-on courses requiring personal protective clothing (Full Gear) must include NFPA compliant: helmet, protective hood, bunker coat & pants (3/4 boots won't be allowed in lieu of pants), firefighting boots, gloves, and self-contained breathing apparatus. Please note: Persons with beards (facial hair that contacts the SCBA seal) will NOT be allowed to participate in the hands-on session of class. They may be able to participate in classroom and classes not.

Registration Check-in

Registration will take place in the NECAS Building, located on the Peosta Campus. All participants must check in at the registration desk before proceeding to their classes. Classroom assignments and locations will be included in the registration packet.

Saturday Programs

Basic Firefighting

The basic skills taught in this course are important for a new firefighter. Basics of protective clothing, SCBA, hose and nozzle handling, ladder work, and engine company operations are among topics covered. Hands-on practice of basic skills is an important part of the Basic firefighter. Full bunker gear and SCBA required. Facial hair policy will be enforced.

Responding to a Crime Scene EMS: Optional

This course will look at the normal every day calls that Fire and EMS personnel respond to that can potentially turn out to be crime scenes. We will cover what to do and what not to do at these types of scenes. How Fire and EMS can help Law enforcement in protecting the scene. Topic's will include Ambulance calls including death, suicide and assaults, Accident scenes where there is serious injury or death, Fire scenes that are suspicious in nature and Clandestine laboratories covering both the Anhydrous and Red Phosphorus Methods of manufacturing Methamphetamine. Report writing and court testimony will also be covered as part of the class.

Tractor Rollover EMS: Formal

The tractor rollover extrication training program will give the student an in-depth look at how tractors roll over and new safety devices that help stabilize a tractor including Roll-Over Protection Systems (ROPS). The hands on portion of the program will deal with trauma patient care, cribbing, extrication tools. Students will perform several evolutions in patient extrication. Full turnout gear is required. Students will gain knowledge on how to safely conduct a tractor rollover incident.

Auto Extrication EMS: Optional

This one day course will introduce the participants to vehicle anatomy, scene assessment, hazard control, scene stabilization, disentanglement techniques and procedures and personnel safety. Extrication techniques will be preformed on a number of different vehicles by the participants utilizing various hand, pneumatic and hydraulic tools. Participants must be in good physical condition and able to lift heavy objects. Full bunker gear with eye protection required

Forcible Entry

This class will cover the basic tactics of gaining entry to multiple structures including: all types of doors, fences, gates, floors, walls, and windows. The class will also use hands on evolutions to familiarize the students with multiple forcible entry tools including: hand tools, cutting tools, and different tool combinations. We will also discuss entry methods through different types of locks. Student will need full PPE excluding SCBA.

High Angle Rescue

Students will learn and practice all areas of rope rescue in a high-angle environment. Students are trained in pre-planning and size-up of rope rescue operations; knots, bends, hitches and anchor systems; belay operations; ascending and descending lines; mechanical advantage systems, rising and lowering systems; and patient packaging and litter attending. Safety of the rescuer, rescue team, patient and bystanders will be stressed at all times.

Roadway Safety for Emergency

Fire, EMS, and Law Enforcement personnel routinely respond to emergency incidents on our nation's roadways. In an unfortunate trend, emergency responders are increasingly falling victim to "secondary incidents" that occur as they attend to the original incident to which they were dispatched. Though secondary incidents can take any number of forms, they most often involve emergency responders being struck by vehicles. In an effort to create a safer working environment, Federal Law now requires firefighters and all other responders to wear ANSI approved High Visibility Vests when working on federally funded roadways, effective November 24, 2008. This class will cover this and other federal requirements as well as how emergency personnel can operate safely at roadway incidents.

Topics include:
• ANSI approved High Visibility Vests
• Temporary Traffic Control Devices
• Staging Apparatus at Emergency Scenes
• Apparatus Markings and Warning Lights

Students will utilize tabletop exercises to reinforce the importance of proper staging of apparatus and use of temporary traffic control devices to create safe work zones. The class will conclude with several case studies of traffic related fire fighter fatalities presented by the students.

Advanced Medical Life Support

AMLS is a sixteen (16) hour, two-day program that consists of interactive lectures, teaching and evaluation stations. The interactive/case based lectures include the following topics: Patient Assessment, Airway Management, Assessment of the Shock Patient, Dyspnea/Respiratory Failure, Chest Pain, altered Mental Status, and Abdominal Pain. Teaching stations follow the associated lectures each day. This program is for all levels of healthcare practitioners committed to providing quality care for patients in medical crisis. AMLS is the first course that offers a "think-outside-the-box" method of assessing and managing a patient in medical crisis.
